## **REJOICE ON PALM SUNDAY**

Hold your palms high as you recall the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem at church today – then continue the celebration at home.

**Jesus Centerpiece:** place a statue or picture of Jesus at the center of your dinner table and lay palm branches around it.

Talk about ways to make Jesus the center of your life and your faith.

**Blessed Palms** are respected as sacramental, place them behind the crucifix in your home

## HOLY WEEK PREPARATION DAYS Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday

**Clean the House:** Think of spring housekeeping as a prayerful preparation for Easter and celebrate all that is fresh and new.

**Buy a Lily:** The white flower heralds the resurrection of Jesus – share a plant with someone who needs to hear "good news".

**Color eggs:** Decorated eggs are a symbol of new life that comes with the resurrection. Try writing "Alleluia" or "Christ is Risen" on the eggs with a crayon before coloring them.

## **GIVE THANKS ON HOLY THURSDAY**

This day recalls the Last Supper when Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and shared a sacred meal with them. It reminds us that we are called to serve one another. Here are some ideas:

**Attend church service:** Listen to the readings that mark the beginning of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

**Share a meal:** If your church doesn't have a community meal, plan your own with neighbors or friends. Thank and serve one another.

**Read and reflect:** Read one of the Gospel accounts of the Last Supper and reflect on how this encounter with Jesus changed the disciples. How does it change you?

## REMEMBER AND FORGIVE ON GOOD FRIDAY

This day commemorates the crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus. It is the most solemn and sorrowful day of the Church Year.

**Spend time in church**: pray the Way of the Cross, attend services of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross, Seven Last Words, and Communion

**Quiet time:** Tradition places the events of Good Friday between 12 noon and 3:00 pm, turn off the computer or social media and read the bible account of Jesus' death.

**Forgive:** Imitate Jesus and reach out to someone who has hurt you. Forgive and forget! Celebrate the healing of your relationship.

**Talk About** those who have died and how we believe that, because of Jesus ,we hope to rise to new life in heaven.

### WELCOME LIGHT AND LIFE ON HOLY SATURDAY

This day commemorates the time of darkness and waiting when Jesus was in the tomb.

**Volunteer as a family**: Help decorate the church for Easter, or deliver baskets to the homebound.

**Talk about** the symbols of fire and water, signs of Jesus the light of the world and fountain of new life.

Lord God. you loved this world so much, that you gave your one and only Son, that we might be called your children too. Lord, help us to live in the gladness and grace of Easter Sunday, everyday. ## **DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY**

The Feast of Divine Mercy (established by St. Pope John Paul II) is celebrated on the Sunday after Easter each year. April 28, 2019 is a special day to reflect on God's love for us and to extend that love to one another. God's Mercy pours out in blood and water from his Sacred Heart and our compassion should flow out toward family, friends and especially those less fortunate in life. Our Lord's words to St Faustina Kowalska as recorded in her Diary are clear:

"I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over its enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory."

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed daily by many faithful believers. Often the chaplet is recited at the bed of the sick and the dying. # CELBRATE THE LOVE OF TWO HEARTS

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus (June 28th) became popular in the 17<sup>th</sup>



century through the mystic visions of St. Mary Margaret Alacoque. Christ reveals that His Sacred Heart, though wounded by our sins, is overflowing with mercy and love, a fount of heavenly gifts to all who honor Him in their home as a sign that the Heart of Jesus reigns over their family. Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary (June 29th) was popularized by St. John Eudes in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. As Mary's heart was a fit dwelling place for the Holy Spirit at the Incarnation, we pray that we may be filled with that same Spirit and become worthy temples of God's glory.



The **Divine Mercy image** is a depiction of Jesus based on the devotion initiated by Saint Faustina Kowalska.

"Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: "Jesus, I trust in You". I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish."

Jesus is shown raising his right hand in blessing, and pointing with his left hand on his chest from which flow forth two rays: one red and one white (translucent). The depictions often contains the message "Jesus, I trust in You!". The rays streaming out have symbolic meaning: red for the blood of Jesus (which is the Life of Souls), and pale for the water (which justify souls) (*from Diary - 299*). The whole image is symbolic of charity, forgiveness and love of God, referred to as the "Fountain of Mercy". According to the diary of St Faustina, the image is based on her 1931 vision of Jesus.

## Our Model as a Disciple .....

Mary followed the teachings of her Son, Jesus. At the wedding feast of Cana she asked him to perform a miracle instructing the servants to "do whatever He tells you". Mary is present in the heart-wrenching agony of the crucifixion and death of Jesus. From the cross, Jesus gave the care of His Mother to John and entrusted John and all of us to her motherly protection. Mary is believed to have traveled with John to Ephesus, in modern day Turkey. A small house in the hills above the historic ruins of the city is venerated as Mary's House. Three popes have journeyed to this pilgrimage site; it is known as a place of healing and peace.

## Our Model as a Woman of Faith.....

Jesus' practice of and understanding of the Jewish faith as recorded in the New Testament points to the fact that His parents were observant members of the people of Israel. Mary and Joseph followed the Jewish religion in their home — following the Torah keeping the Sabbath, holy days and festivals, and attending the synagogue. Luke depicts Mary praying with the other women in the Upper Room at Pentecost, establishing her as a prominent member of the early Christian community in Jerusalem.



#### Our Mother .....

The Gospels tell us that Mary was a peasant woman who became a mother at a young age. She was a woman of integrity who when faced with the awesome responsibility of becoming the Mother of God, said yes without hesitation. Mary experienced many of the same joys and challenges as parents today. In Luke's gospel we read of her anxiety when Jesus was lost in the Temple for three days. What panic she and Joseph must have felt! When found, Jesus tells them not to worry for He was in His Father's house. Relieved at finding Jesus safe, Mary "kept all these things in her heart". She treasured His words of faith and commitment to God.




## MAY CELEBRATION

A Spiritual Bouquet consists of prayers and deeds offered as a special gift. During the month of May, give Mary a spiritual bouquet in thanksgiving, for a special request, or simply to honor her example of faith.

As a reminder cover the kitchen or dining room table with a blue cloth, place a statue of Mary in the center with one or more candles aside of it. Lay a rosary at the base of the statue and keep a vase of fresh flowers there to remind you of your spiritual bouquet.

Choose Joy by Brooke Taylor pulls together an ecumenical team of Christian writers who share their reflections and help the reader form their own circle of friends. The book includes 52 devotions (one for each week of the year) which begin with a scripture reading, share a life story, and provide reflective questions for discussion. Readers are encouraged to:

- Grab a cup of tea or coffee
- Read the scripture passage and put yourself into the story.
- Pray and invite the Holy Spirit to "use your pen (or colored pencils, watercolors, markers) to uncover, reveal, inspire, and surprise you with an insight or discernment"
- Reflect on the questions either individually or with a group

## **CONFIRMED IN THE HOLY SPIRIT**

**WISDOM** is the first and highest gift of the Holy Spirit because it is the perfection of the theological virtue of faith. Through wisdom, we come to value properly those things which we believe through faith. The truths of Christian belief are more important than the things of this world, and wisdom helps us to order our relationship to the created world properly, loving Creation for the sake of God, rather than for its own sake.

**UNDERSTANDING** is the second gift of the Holy Spirit, and people sometimes have a hard time understanding (no pun intended) how it differs from wisdom. While wisdom is the desire to contemplate the things of God, understanding allows us to grasp, at least in a limited way, the very essence of the truths of the Catholic faith. Through understanding, we gain a certitude about our beliefs that moves beyond faith.

**COUNSEL**, the third gift, is the perfection of the virtue of prudence. Prudence can be practiced by anyone, but counsel is supernatural. Through this gift of the Holy Spirit, we are able to judge how best to act almost by intuition. Because of the gift of counsel, Christians need not fear to stand up for the truths of the faith, because the Holy Spirit will guide us in defending those truths.

**FORTITUDE** is ranked as the fourth gift of the Holy Spirit because it gives us the strength to follow through on the actions suggested by the gift of counsel. While fortitude is sometimes called *courage*, it goes beyond what we normally think of as courage. Fortitude is the virtue of the martyrs that allows them to suffer death rather than to renounce the Christian Faith.

**KNOWLEDGE,** the fifth gift, is often confused with both wisdom and understanding. Like wisdom, knowledge is the perfection of faith, but whereas wisdom gives us the desire to judge all things according to the truths of the faith, knowledge is the actual ability to do so. Like counsel, it is aimed at our actions in this life. In a limited way, knowledge allows us to see the circumstances of our life the way that God sees them. Through this gift of the Spirit, we can determine God's purpose for our lives and live accordingly.

**PIETY,** the sixth gift, is the perfection of the virtue of religion. While we tend to think of religion today as the external elements of our faith, it really means the willingness to worship and to serve God. Piety takes that willingness beyond a sense of duty so that we desire to worship God and to serve Him out of love, the way that we desire to honor our parents and do what they wish.

**FEAR OF THE LORD**, the seventh and final gift of the Holy Spirit is often misunderstood. We think of fear and hope as opposites, but the fear of the Lord confirms the theological virtue of hope. This gift of the Holy Spirit gives us the desire not to offend God, as well as the certainty that God will supply us the grace that we need in order to keep from offending Him. Our desire not to offend God is more than simply a sense of duty; like piety, the fear of the Lord arises out of love.



Once again, we come to the time of year when catechumens, candidates, and students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. This important step toward full initiation as adult believers brings powerful gifts of the Holy Spirit.
